BUILDING A BETTER BELOIT THROUGH POSITIVE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES »

Family Services is hosting its **Annual Fall Luncheon** on **September 26th.** The event will feature **Dr. Robert Sege**, Boston pediatrician and lead author of the newly released report "Balancing ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences) with HOPE (Healthy Outcomes of Positive Experiences).

Adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) are stressful or traumatic events, including abuse and neglect. They may also include household dysfunction such as witnessing domestic violence or growing up with family members who have substance use disorders.

Adverse childhood experiences and the wide-ranging health and social problems they generate are our nation's leading *public health* problem. They are the most basic and long-lasting cause of health risk behaviors, mental illness, social malfunction, disease, disability, death, and healthcare costs.

This message is relevant to all those interested in strengthening our community. Childhood experiences have a tremendous, lifelong impact on health and quality of life. Local educators, school board members, medical practitioners, social services providers, and interested and concerned community members are invited to attend the event to hear Dr. Sege's message and consider how we as a community might come together to improve outcomes for Beloit's children.



Nathalia Zamaro, a member of Youth2Youth 4 Change and a student at Beloit Memorial High School, was selected to serve as a member of the State Youth Board of Directors for the FACT Movement, Wisconsin's youth tobacco prevention program. Zamaro was selected because of her remarkable leadership skills and commitment to spreading the truth about tobacco.

Founded in 2001, FACT is a youth-driven movement where teens in grades 7 – 12 work together to conduct school and community based advocacy initiatives that educate teens about the dangers of tobacco. Since its inception, FACT members have helped lower youth smoking rates by supporting proven policies like higher tobacco taxes and smoke-free air laws. FACT is part of the Wisconsin Department of Health Services' Tobacco Prevention and Control Program and is managed by the American Lung Association

Zamaro is one of 23 teens from throughout Wisconsin who will serve a one-year term where they will provide overall leadership, guidance and feedback to FACT.

However, she states, "I have also witnessed the barriers and the needs of the Latino community and that has inspired me to do this work because I am able to help my community and be a voice for them."

"The most rewarding thing about this job is when you are able to make a difference in a person's life. The most challenging, is witnessing how other systems failed and negatively impacted our clients and not having the power to do anything about that."

Amanda believes her colleagues are the best part of Family Services, "they are all great people and make it feel like a second home." In addition to her full-time position with SARP, she is also active in the S.O.S. Latino Committee.

When not working or volunteering, Amanda can be found at home spending time with her family, especially her handsome 7-year-old son, Emiliano, who is her main motivation for all she does.

STRATEGIC PLAN COMPLETED»

THANKS TO PARTICIPATION FROM THE COMMUNITY, BOARD AND STAFF >>

In February 2017, the Family Services Board and Staff, with the help of focus groups made up of members of the community, began the task of developing a new three-year strategic plan. The process was facilitated by Pam Clark Reidenbach, MSSW, Director, Northern Illinois Center for Nonprofit Excellence (NICNE) at Rockford University.

As a group, they looked at the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats that relate to the agency and its eight programs, being mindful of disruptive factors and positive and negative trends such as the shifting expectations of the social services sector, changes in consumer demand, federal grant uncertainty, healthcare reform and neuroscience impact, all of which could affect client needs as well as financial and program sustainability.



Using input from the participating parties and best practices, five goals were developed with accompanying strategies for their implementation, accountability, timeframe and indicators of quality. This strategic plan will help guide the agency as we continue to restore and enhance lives in our community through advocacy, education, counseling and case management.


